



WORLD CUP CRICKETEERS

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. When do applications close to become a World Cup Cricketeer?

A. Applications close on the 15th June 2018.

Q. When will interviews commence to become a World Cup Cricketeer?

A. Interviews commence on the 7th July, and we will be in contact shortly after the applications close to let you know if you have been invited to interview. The dates for interviews can be found [here](#)

Q. Am I required to come to interview?

A. Yes – all volunteering positions at the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019 are subject to attending interview.

Q. I won't be 18 at the time of the tournament, can I still apply to be a World Cup Cricketeer?

A. Due to safeguarding purposes, we are unable to offer a volunteering role to anybody who is under the age of 18 by the 20th May 2019.

Q. I currently live abroad. Can the ICC Cricket World Cup cover the cost of my travel to the UK?

A. We are unable to provide any financial support to cover transport or accommodation costs. Furthermore, we are unable to provide Visa advice, or sponsor individuals to work in the UK. All selected volunteers must have the right to work in the UK to be part of the World Cup Cricketeers programme.

Q. Will I be guaranteed the volunteer role and venue I have selected in my application?

A. We always try to match applicants with their preferred role and venue, but unfortunately this isn't always possible and your flexibility in this regard is greatly appreciated.

Q. Am I able to apply for tickets for the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019 and be a volunteer during the tournament?

A. Yes – World Cup Cricketeers are welcome to apply for tickets, although we ask that your volunteering shifts take priority. Please note that all volunteers will be required to undertake a minimum of 3 shifts during the tournament.
