

**In the matter of Commission proceedings brought by the Premier League Board under the
Premier League Rules against Hull City Tigers Limited**

**SUPPLEMENTARY DECISION
INCLUDING UNDERTAKINGS AND COSTS**

1. In its Decision dated 20 July 2017, the Commission found that the Club acted in breach of Rule R.8 in the 2016/17 season because it did not make available any concessionary ticket prices for senior citizens or junior supporters. The parties have agreed to resolve further outstanding issues in the light of the Decision on the following terms.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE PREMIER LEAGUE AND THE CLUB

Undertakings as to future conduct

2. The Club has undertaken to the Premier League that, in the event it becomes a member of the Premier League at any point in the future, then it will (unless the Premier League agrees otherwise in writing and in advance, or unless there is a material change to Rule R.8):
 - i) during all periods when it is a member of the Premier League operate a ticketing scheme that (among other things) complies with Rule R.8 as that rule has been interpreted by the Commission in its decision dated 20 July 2017; and
 - ii) during all periods when it is a member of the Premier League between until 1 June 2022 make no fewer than 10% of its home supporter tickets available for purchase by:
 - (1) senior citizens (i.e. those aged 65 or over); and
 - (2) junior supporters (i.e. those aged 14 or younger, though these may be restricted to one per adult ticket purchased),

at prices that are discounted (when compared with a standard adult ticket in the same part of the ground) by no less than 10%.

Appeal

3. The Club waives all of its rights of appeal against the Commission's Decision dated 20 July 2017, whether under Rule W.61 or otherwise.

Costs

4. The Club shall pay to the Premier League Board all of the costs of the Commission members (including fees, travel and accommodation costs) and the transcription costs; and an agreed contribution towards the Premier League Board's costs.

FURTHER DECISION BY THE COMMISSION

5. Given those terms, it is submitted by both the Premier League and the Club that the Commission should make no order under Rule W.54 as to sanction, except to record the matters set out above and provide that the Decision and this Further Decision may be made public.
6. Having considered all the circumstances, including the terms that have been agreed and, in particular, the undertakings given as to future conduct by the Club, the Commission (i) **decides** that it should not exercise its power to make any order under Rule W.54 as to ordering any sanction against the Club, (ii) **records** the matters set out above and (iii) **orders** that the Decision and this Further Decision may be made public.
